He finished his Master's and Doctor degree in Ophthalmology in Mansoura University, Egypt and received his Doctoral Degree in Medical

Science in the University of Leuven, Belgium. His specialties are on vitreo-retinal diseases and surgery, uveitis and immunopathogenesis of ocular inflammatory disease. Prof. Abu El-Asrar has published research papers in different international and peer reviewed journals. He is a reviewer, subeditor and associate editor in several international and national journals. He is a member of the Research Council, Ethics Committee and Review Board in King Saud University and King Khaled Eye Specialist Hospital, Riyadh, Saudi Arabia. He is regularly invited as speaker and lecturer in several international ophthalmology congress and courses as well as an external examiner. He is a member of the International Uveitis Study Group, Club Jules Gonin and other international societies in uveitis and retina. His major research interest is diabetic retinopathy.

Andrea Leonardi is assistant professor in Ophthalmology at the Neuroscience Department University of Padua University. After his Research Fellowship

versity. After his Research Fellowship at the Schepens Institute in Boston working on the pathophysiology of allergic reaction in animal models, he has been board certified in Ophthal-

mology and in Allergy and Clinical Immunology at the University of Padua. He is now director of the Ocular Surface and Allergy outpatient service and the Ocular Immunology Laboratory at the Ophthalmology Unit of Padua University hospital. His primary clinical and research interests is ocular allergy, dry eye and immunology, in particular, the immunopathogenesis of ocular allergy and vernal keratoconjunctivitis, tear proteins, inflammatory mediators, tissue remodelling and fibroblast behaviour. Project Director for development of new cold plasma technology, involving the treatment of ocular surface infection in conjunction with the Nuclear Physics Institute and the Consorzio RFX of the Padua University. He has several collaborations with Universities and Institutions in Europe and USA. He is principle instructor of Ophthalmology at the School of Medicine, Ocular Inflammatory Diseases at the Allergy and Clinical Immunology residency, and Ocular Anatomy, Physiology and Pharmacology, at the Optometry School of Padua University. Vice president of the Italian Society for Uveitis and Ocular Inflammatory Disease (SIUMIO), and Chairmen of the Interest Group in Ocular Allergy of the European Academy of Allergy and Clinical Immunology (EAACI). He has long experience as peer reviewer and guest editor with numerous International journals and as principal investigators of numerous clinical trials. Author of more than 100 publications in Pier Review Journals and Chapters in several Books.

Khalid F. Tabbara



Khalid F. Tabbara, MD, ABO, FRCOphth [Ed] is currently the Chairman of the Saudi Scientific Board of Ophthalmology at the Saudi Council For Health Specialties in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, Adjunct Professor of Ophthalmology at Wilmer Ophthalmological Institute of The Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine, Baltimore, Maryland, USA, Medical Di-

rector of The Eye Center, and Director of The Eye Foundation for Research in Ophthalmology, Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, and Clinical Professor of Department of Ophthalmology, College of Medicine, King Saud University, Riyadh, Saudi Arabia.

Dr. Tabbara is certified by the American Board of Ophthalmology (ABO), and a Fellow of the Royal College of Ophthalmologists of United Kingdom.

Dr. Tabbara is former Professor and Chairman at Department of Ophthalmology, College of Medicine King Saud University, and Research Director at King Khaled Eye Specialist Hospital, Riyadh, Saudi Arabia. Dr. Tabbara was Associate Professor of Ophthalmology at Department of Ophthalmology and The Francis I. Proctor Foundation, University of California in San Francisco. He served as an Examiner in the American Board of Ophthalmology (ABO) for 32 years. Dr. Tabbara also served as President of the International Uveitis Study Group (IUSG), Paris, France in the period of 1996 to 2000. Dr. Tabbara is Founding President of the Arab Board of Ophthalmology and served as President in the period of 1994 to 1998.

Dr. Tabbara established the Research Department of the King Khaled Eye Specialist Hospital in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, and in 1983 led the team that completed the largest survey of blindness in Saudi Arabia. Dr. Tabbara received research grants from the National Institutes of Health, Bethesda, Maryland, the University of California, and the King Abdul-Aziz City for Science and Technology (KACST). Dr. Tabbara's main research focused on ocular immunology and microbiology, infections of the eye, uveitis, cornea, and external eye diseases. Dr. Tabbara completed several field projects in Saudi Arabia on Trachoma in school children, treatment of Trachoma with azithromycin, Trachoma in Saudi Arabia, blindness in Saudi Arabia, and Toxoplasmosis in Saudi Arabia.

Dr. Tabbara organized and initiated the first four-year structured residency program in Ophthalmology in the Middle East, the joint King Saud University/King Khaled Eye Specialist Hospital (KSU-KKESH) Residency Program that graduated over 200 highly qualified ophthalmologists.

Dr. Tabbara acted as an Advisor and Consultant in the launching of the Residency Programs in Oman and Kuwait and served as External Examiner in the Examination Boards of Ophthalmology in both countries.

Dr. Tabbara established the Saudi Ophthalmologic society, the Saudi Ophthalmological Society (SOS). It was the first Subspecialty society in Saudi Arabia under the umbrella of King Saud University (KSU), Riyadh, Saudi Arabia. More than 25 other societies followed and were later established in Saudi Arabia in various other subspecialties. Several other Ophthalmologic societies followed and were established in the region including Kuwait, Bahrain, United Arab Emirates, Qatar and Oman.

Dr. Tabbara was the Founding Editor and former Editor-in-Chief of the Saudi Journal of Ophthalmology (SJO), the official journal of the Saudi Ophthalmological Society. He is an advisory member of the editorial boards of JAMA Middle East, International Ophthalmology Clinics, International Journal of Ophthalmology, Ophthalmic Epidemiology, Ocular Inflammation and Immunology.

Dr. Tabbara received Gold Medal Awards from the Pakistani Ophthalmological Society, the Saudi Ophthalmological Society and the Pan-Arab Council of Ophthalmology. Dr. Tabbara received American Academy of Ophthalmology Awards for four Scientific Posters and first Exhibition Awards, and for Distinguished services in the educational programs. Dr. Tabbara also received the Physician's Recognition award for the Continuing Medical Education from the American Medical Association.

Dr. Tabbara received the Senior Honor Award from the American Academy of Ophthalmology (AAO). Dr. Tabbara received the Best Research Project Award from the Saudi Ophthalmological Society during its Tenth Annual Scientific Meeting in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia.

Dr. Tabbara received the Trachoma Gold Medal award for the year 2000 from The International Organization Against Trachoma (IOAT) during the 106th Congress of the French Ophthalmological Society, held on May 7, 2000 in Paris, France (IOAT awards the Gold Medal to one scientist who has contributed to the control of Trachoma in the world)

Dr. Tabbara is a recipient of the "Lifetime Achievement Award" from the Hellenic Society for the Study of Ocular Inflammations and Infections awarded during the Sixth Panhellenic Congress of Ocular Inflammations and Infections where he gave the G. Palimeris Honorary Lecture. The meeting was held in the period of November 12-14, 2010 in Joannina. Greece.

Dr. Tabbara is the recipient of The Gold Medal Award 2011 of the Saudi Ophthalmological Society (SOS) and delivered the Gold Medal Lecture during its annual meeting (Saudi Ophthalmology 2011) in the period of 27 February-02 March 2011 at King Fahd Cultural Center. Riuadh.

Dr. Tabbara is the author of over 380 scientific publications. He is also the author, co-author or guest editor of many chapters and has 20 books in Ophthalmology.

Dr. Tabbara is currently active in residents teaching, research, continuing medical education, and clinical ophthalmology.

Peter Watson

(Gerasimos Palimeris Lecture)



Peter Watson, MA, MB, BChir, FRCS, FRCOphth

Peter Watson trained at Queens' College Cambridge and University College, London. During this period he compiled "Metabolic Integrations" the first publication about all those reactions that feed into the Krebs Cycle.

He held posts in general medicine,

general surgery, neurosurgery, gynaecology and plastic surgery before training in ophthalmology at the Institute of Ophthalmology and Moorfields Eye Hospital in London establishing the scleritis clinic which has resulted in the publication of "The Sclera and Systemic Disorders"; Its third edition in 2012 with Drs Hazleman, Pavesio and McClusky.

Following his appointment Addenbrooke's University Hospital in Cambridge he and his colleague John Cairns initiated and developed the operation of trabeculectomy. Shortly after this he also established the Cambridge Ophthalmological Symposium which brings together basic scientists and clinicians. It is now in its 44th uear.

In 1995 -2005 he initiated and organized the International Council of Ophthalmology Assessments for Ophthalmologists. Over 2000 candidates a year from 78 countries now take this examination.

He has recently relinquished the Presidency of the Academia Ophthalmologica Internationalis.

In 1999 an appointment as Boerhaave Professor in the University of Leiden in The Netherlands led to the successful organ transplantation of ciliary body in the rabbit.

He has lectured widely giving 9 eponymous lectures world wide andhas been awarded, the Doyne Memorial Medal, the Royal College of Ophthalmologists Fellowship, (Honoris Causi), the Krwawicz Gold Medal in Poland 2000, the Duke Elder International Gold Medal in 2002, the American Academy of Ophthalmology Honorary membership, Honour Award, and Achievement Award 1986, 2001, 2004, the Claus Dohlman Award of the Corneal Society of America and the Jules Francois Golden Research Medal of the International Council of Ophthalmology in 2014

He is author of three books, 20 Chapters in Textbooks and 170 Papers peer reviewed journals. His latest interest is in the diseases suffered by, and the reasons for the blindness of the famous astronomer and mathematician Galileo Galilei

Vishali Gupta



Prof Vishali Gupta is an accomplished vitreo-retina and uvea expert of international repute working at Post Graduate Institute of Medical Education and Research Chandigarh-India. She has keen interest in the inflammation and infections of eye and has a lot of original work on intraocular tuberculosis, fungal infections and diabetic

retinopathy. She is a sought after speaker and has delivered more than 500 invited lectures and conducted instruction courses at several international and national meetings. She 110 publications in peer-reviewed journals; has edited three books and contributed 26 book chapters in textbooks. She is a member of international uveitis study group, American Academy of Ophthalmology and only Indian to be the member of Club Jules Gonin and The Macula Society. She has received several named awards and also holds a US patent for multiplex PCR.
